Norman “Mike” Meyer, a retired electrician, died Sunday in the Town of Tonawanda. He was 84.

Born in Buffalo, he served in the Navy during World War II on the USS Silverstein. He was an electrician at Ferguson Electric in Buffalo for almost 35 years and a member of Local 41, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. He retired in the 1980s.

Mr. Meyer was a life member of the Grand Island Fire Company; Post 1346, American Legion; and Grand Island Lodge 180, Loyal Order of Moose. He was a supporter of the

Plant 6 Softball Club, a local slow-pitch softball team that traveled throughout New York State for tournaments.

He is survived by his wife of 59 years, the former Doris “Dodie” Dekdebrun; a son, Michael; and two daughters, Diane Schwartz and Susan Gallagher.
