Here are a few UPDATES that I wanted to share with you this month:

- We have some Rapid COVID –19 Test Kits available for our members. Should you need some, please come in and ask to pick up your allotment. *First come, first served*.
- ATTENTION: Please read this carefully: Our mandates have changed QUICKLY. With that being said, here are the following changes that have taken place this month: The mask mandates are no longer in place, as well as social distancing. We are NO LONGER asking our 3 COVID questions as you enter our building. Please know that as you enter our building from the front door or the back door, we will welcome you to our senior center and sign you in, and will ask you what program you will be participating in. Remember to sign out with us as you leave the senior center for the day; this is for your safety. Our normal cleaning and disinfecting will happen throughout the day. Should you wish to stay for lunch, drinks, silverware and napkins will be passed out to you, and then participants will walk up to the Kitchen window to pick up their meals. Those who wish to brown bag their lunch, we welcome you with open arms! Thank you for abiding by the rules and being respectful of one another! We appreciate your respectfulness and we appreciate your cooperation.
- Calling all artists and creative spirits! We have a new *Featured Member Artists* area in our senior center, and we KNOW how talented you ALL are! We welcome members that wish to display art work of their very own! Should you wish to display your work, please contact Jen at (716) 773-9682!
- Take out meals will cost \$1 extra, to defray the cost of the container. Should you return the container, you will receive your \$1 back. This is due to the rising costs of take out containers, due to the Styrofoam ban. *Thank you for understanding*.
- Feel free to bring a plastic container to bring home your leftovers from lunch home in if lunch is too big for you. We strive to make lunch your biggest meal of the day. You may also brown bag your lunch anytime here too! Join us for lunch and enjoy the comradery and friendship.

Senior Wishes is seeking wish applicants



Senior Wishes, a WNY non-profit founded by the United Church Home Society, strives to fulfill wishes that may have been set aside by older adults. As vaccinations increase and our communities safely re-open, Senior Wishes is looking forward to re-engaging with qualifying seniors.

A wish can be any meaningful experience the recipient deeply desires. Past wishes have included visiting museums, celebrations for milestone birthdays, and lessons or supplies to revisit an abandoned hobby. Sometimes, a senior just needs a small household item to bring them some cheer.

According to Wendy Miller Backman, Executive Director, "Senior Wishes was created to foster respect and appreciation by providing seniors with a life enriching experience to be remembered. These are people who have spent their lives serving our country, caring for others, volunteering in the community and raising their families. We want them to know they are not forgotten."

Qualifying seniors may submit an application which is reviewed bi-monthly by a volunteer wish granting committee. After approval, a Senior Wishes representative will work together with the senior to plan the details of their wish. Community members are encouraged to reach out to deserving seniors, talk to them about their needs/dreams, and help them fill out the paperwork.

Wish recipients must be 65+ and a resident of Western New York with an annual income under \$38,000 for a household of one or under \$44,000 for a household of two. Permanent residents of care facilities are exempt from the income qualification.

Vacations, medical items, furniture, household repairs, bill payments and travel outside of the continental U.S. are excluded.



*By calling 211, ask to make an appointment for the AARP Tax Preparation Program at the Kenmore Library on Delaware Road, and the volunteer representative will set up an appointment once all details are finalized and they will make sure your tax return is something they can handle as well AND will go over the proper documentation required.
