

saving assistance to eligible homeowners/tenants. The scope of work can include: furnace replacements, hot water tanks, spray foam insulation, cellulose insulation, health and safety repairs and some homeowners receive a new refrigerator/freezer. If the homeowner isn't income qualified for EmPower+, NYSERDA's Comfort Home program is available to anyone regardless of income. Any funding from these programs is at 100% no cost to the homeowner.

Associates from EmpowerNY will be here to discuss this program with Golden Age members.


