- We have Rapid COVID -19 Test Kits available for our members, as well as masks. With variants still going around, and NOW, with colds and viruses going around, should you need some tests or masks, please come in and ask to pick some up! We are happy to help you. Should you want us to bring them to you outside, through our Drive Thru, just call us at (716) 773-9682, and we'd be happy to bring them out to you, especially if you feel you are sick OR feel you have been exposed. Protect yourself and LET'S PROTECT each other.
- Please know that as you enter our building from the front door or the back door, we will welcome you to our senior center and sign you in, and will ask you what program you will be participating in. Remember to sign out with us as you leave the senior center for the day; this is for your safety. Our normal cleaning and disinfecting will happen throughout the day. Should you wish to stay for lunch, pick up your drinks and silverware, and then participants will walk up to the Kitchen window to pick up their meals. Those who wish to brown bag their lunch, we welcome you with open arms! Thank you for abiding by the rules and being respectful of one another! We appreciate your respectfulness and we appreciate your cooperation. After the Kitchen closes for the day, you can help yourself to our Coffee Corner or to the water fountain. Bring your water bottles—help be earth conscious!
- We kindly ask for your understanding and patience when our staff members are on the phone or working in the
 Kitchen. We kindly ask that you do not bang on the plexiglass. Among other things, we are assisting homebound
 members, coordinating Meals on Wheels volunteer schedules and coordinating medical appointments for our vans,
 and cooking food for our members, and helping our members with resources, and answering many questions.
 Please be assured that we will assist you as soon as we are able to do so.
- Your safety is of our utmost importance. PLEASE sign in at the Office when you come in and sign OUT when you leave our senior center, so that we know of your whereabouts. With this being a public building, safety is our TOP priority, and not only do we strive to make this the MOST warm and welcoming place, we want to preserve our fun, safe and happy atmosphere. *Thank you for your cooperation!*
- How good are the RAPID COVID-19 ANTIGEN home tests past their expiration dates? Good question. For the CareStart tests we've been passing out, based on the guidance of a local pharmacist AND with the guidance of Erie County Health Department and the distributor, they are good 12 MONTHS past their expiration date, and they will still give an accurate reading. If you are using a different brand, please give Jen a call for more detailed information.
- When walking outside on the Nike Base, hiking the trails, playing outside, playing tennis or baseball, did you know that there is an accessible restroom to use, after hours? It is on the back side of the Community Center, facing the Tennis Courts.
