I HEREBY CERTIFY, That at a regular session of the Legislature of Erie County, held in the County Hall, in the City of Buffalo, on the 10th day of May, 2018 A.D., a resolution was adopted, of which the following is a true copy:

WHEREAS, The Erie County Legislature seeks to honor individuals and institutions of Erie County who enhance the quality of life in the community and throughout the county; and

WHEREAS, the origins of Mother's Day dates back to 1870, when Julia Ward Howe, a poet known for her work titled "Battle Hymn of the Republic" worked to establish a Mother's Peace Day dedicated to peace and the eradication of war; and

WHEREAS, In 1907, Anna Jarvis, began her crusade to have Mother's Day officially recognized, and in 1914, President Woodrow Wilson and the United States Congress did proclaim it a national holiday, setting aside the second Sunday each May, as a "public expression of our love and reverence for all mothers"; and

WHEREAS, Motherhood is one of the most cherished and valued roles in our society, and Mother's Day gives all of us the opportunity to pay tribute to these dedicated women who give unconditional love and guidance to their children, and who make extraordinary sacrifices to ensure that their children are protected and cared for; and

WHEREAS, Every child blessed with a mother's love has been given one of life greatest gifts, and on Mother's Day we celebrate the importance that mothers have on our lives through their influence, love, and nurture; and

WHEREAS, Mother's Day will be celebrated on Sunday May 13, 2018 throughout the United States, and in many other parts of the world including Canada, Australia, Turkey, and much of Europe, which makes this special day a worldwide tribute to mothers everywhere.

**RESOLVED**, the Erie County Legislature pauses in its deliberations to recognize and honor all mothers this **Mother's Day**, including those mothers no longer with us, and to urge all citizens in Erie County to express their love, respect, and gratitude to these pillars and mentors.
