First, there is a Community Education course at the high school starting in March, about the history of Grand Island, arranged and taught by several of our members. In May every 4th grader on Grand Island takes a tour of River Lea, Town Hall including the Town Court, Clerk's Office and the jail cell, and a bus tour of historic sites around the island. It is the Historical Society's single largest annual outreach program and requires many people to be a success. Won't you consider helping? Volunteers <u>DO NOT</u> need to work for every tour (we have 3 days and 2 of the days have 2 tours for a total of 5 tours of River Lea) and even a couple hours of your time can be a huge help. Tour day tasks include River Lea room docent (explain a few things in the room to which you are assigned), River Lea tour guide (move groups from one room/area to the next) and bus guide (teams of two guides on each bus explain the historic sites around the island).
