Then, for whatever reason, he looked and pointed at me and said: "Did you buy my latest album?" to which I promptly responded, "Of course I did!" He said "Very good!" then he started the song. My friend sitting next to me kept saying "You just talked to Ringo!" and I kept saying, "I don't know what just happened? I don't know what I said to him."

Friday morning I found myself happy about my little Ringo connection yet frustrated with the realization that for the past two weeks Ringo was residing in a hotel less than 20 minutes from my home. I decided to implement a plan that would hopefully get him to know that I was breathing air on this planet.

My plan was to hopefully make contact with Jeff Chonis (Ringo's drum technician for 19 years) while he was working up on stage before the concert.

I introduced myself and he was very personable and charming. After some light banter, I asked if he would be kind enough to pass along the shirt that had for Ringo.
