NO STATE (MULTIPLE) DUES INCREASE THIS YEAR...BUT...

Multiple Secretary/Treasurer Tim Jachlewski has indicated the multiple has mitigated the financial stressors placed upon it over the past number of years; therefore no dues increase this year. However, a \$7 increase spread over three years, is up for a vote at the International Convention being held in Boston this year. The proposed increases are \$3 in 2023 and \$2 each for 2024 and 2025. This would be the first increase in international dues since 2011.
