

## GRAND ISLAND VISION SCREENINGS UPDATE

Happy to report that vision screenings have been completed at all public elementary schools and at St. Stephen's on the island. This was followed with screenings at both Island Kids Child Care Center campuses. A total of 816 children, aged six months up to with 6 years, were screened with 62 being



referred for various sight robbing anomalies such as nearand far-sightedness (myopia and hyperopia, respectively); blurred vision (astigmatism), gaze (strabismus - misaligned eyes), unequal refraction, e.g. 20/20 in one eye, 20/200 in the other (anisometropia) and aniscoria (different sized pupils). These screenings yielded a referral rate of 7.6%. Statewide, an uptick of referrals is being witnessed at 20% this year compared to 12.7% last year.

Why the disparity? Poverty plays a key factor especially where children are living. Diet is another. Other factors exist, such as genetics and the amount of screen time children are exposed to, causing these issues. Now it's up to the parents to ensure their children and themselves are getting vision exams annually. With the kids, it is far easier to correct their vision issues now before they get older where uncorrected problems become more permanent.

My thanks to our district's Lions who helped at Sidway and to our Lion Janine who screened at Huth and Kaegebein. Much thanks to the school district staff, the school nurses, the teachers who were a great help in their classes and the parents who allowed us to screen their children at Island Kids. Jack and Jill and hopefully all the other day cares and pre-Ks will follow suit.

One side note: a Sidway teacher came up to me and told me about the wonderful work we Lions do for kids. That was a very nice compliment. Then she dropped a bombshell when she told me that she remembered I screened her class when she was in first grade at Sidway! Wow! Reminds me of the Fiddler song that said "I don't remember growing older; when did they?" LOL
