## VISION SCREENINGS IN PROGRESS

Annual vision screenings have been completed for all grades up to 2 in the Grand Island Central School District. Screenings took place at Sidway, Kaegebein and Huth Road schools January 10-12. In total, 680 children were screened with 54 being referred for further evaluation by qualified ophthalmologists. Thus is less than the 20% referral rate being witnessed in our western New York area and New York State.

Many people are involved in this process and it is with thanks to Cheryl Cardone, Assistant Superintendent of Pupil Personnel Services, the school district's IT staff, the principals, the nurses and the wonderful teachers for allowing us into their classrooms to complete this important work. A Lions roar to the Lions screeners including our Lion Susan Standora who helped accomplish the job at Sidway and to our own Lion Janine Justen who worked with me at Huth and Kaegebein. The job ahead is for the parents and guardians to get the referred children a more comprehensive eye exam and treatment.

Screenings are currently being set up for St. Stephen's and the preschool and daycare centers on the island. If you would be interested in becoming a screener, I'd be happy to show you how. With over 25 years experience and with the advent of new technology, I can show you how easy it is to screen one child in one minute or less. Your small investment of time and effort can make a difference in a child's life. Case in point was one teacher approached me and recollected me doing screenings in her class when she was attending Sidway!
