Congratulations! to DG Mike for spearheading the local effort to seek a Brandel-Murphy emergency grant for a portable generator for a Buffalo family who lost power during the recent blizzard. The significance is their son requires the use of a ventilator around the clock, now at last report, he now needs it when he is sleeping. Without power for three days, the couple had to manually ventilate their son every single moment during that time. Brandel-Murphy members downstate learned of this and contacted DG Mike to see what he could do to mitigate this urgent situation if not then but, in the future, as well. Having three portable generators of his own, he researched the appropriateness of a generator being used to power a life-sustaining medical device such as a ventilator. During this time, some concerns were understandably raised and subsequently satisfied, paving the way to obtaining the grant money to supply the family with their need. The televised presentation of the generator, extension cord and five gallons of gas were made to the boy's mother within days of the grant's approval. They will not have to be concerned about a power outage adversely affecting their child's health and their well-being. Where there's a need, there's a Lion!

This grant and dozens of others are funded with the generous donations made to Brandel-Murphy Youth Foundation through its Super Hero raffle held on Super Bowl Sunday, through regular donations, purchases of Everyday Hero fellowships, and planned and legacy gifts and endowments, thus affording a donor the satisfaction of helping children in need, now and even far beyond the donor's lifetime. Additionally, knowing that many of the current and previous projects not only affect the number of children attested in the applications but those children benefiting from the project that haven't even been born yet give our donors and benefactors a warm sense of doing good. Projects such as vision screeners, playgrounds and educational programs, to name a few, comprise a portion of these types of long-lasting projects. This translates into hundreds of thousands of children, conceivably millions over the lifetime of the project. Though nobody from our district won in this year's raffle, our donors know they are part of the solution to the needs of children. On behalf of Brandel-Murphy Youth Foundation, we extend our gratitude for your generosity.

Throughout our district, 10,842 children to date have benefited from 20 grants valued at \$35,000, the second highest awarded in New York State and Bermuda. These grants aided in projects ranging from a hearing aid for a 13-year-old child in Gowanda to the construction of a playground in Lewiston that will provide enjoyment for 2,000 children annually. Multiply that over a modest 15-year lifespan for a playground and you have 30,000 children enjoying play from an idea that was brought to fruition by a Lions Club with help by a grant from Brandel-Murphy.
