Hosted by the Grand Island PTA

The Grand Island Parent Teacher Association (PTA) will be hosting Meet the Candidates Night on Tuesday, May 12 from 7 – 9 p.m. in the Grand Island High School Professional Development Room. Seven candidates are vying for three seats on the Grand Island Board of Education including the one incumbent and six newcomers. They are, in ballot order: Joy Lamarca, Jeffrey Hassler, Glenn Bobeck (incumbent), Takayuki Nobumoto, Ashli Skura Dreher, Eric Soehnlein, and Richard D'Agostino. The three top vote-getters will be elected to a three-year term on the school board, beginning July 1, 2015.
