HOW TO REGISTER:

- **1. Mail in registration:** Mail in your registration by using the form in the back of this brochure and enclosing required fee(s). Registration forms can also be downloaded from the district Web Site, **www.k12.ginet.org.** All mail registrations must reach the school NO LATER THAN January 23rd and will be given priority according to the date received in the Community Education office.
- **2. <u>NOTIFICATION WILL NOT BE SENT IF ACCEPTED INTO CLASS:</u>** You will be contacted **only** if we are unable to register you for a course. Please write the course number on the registration form.
- **2. Walk it in:** The Community Education office is located in the Grand Island High School, Room #145. We will also have one night of walk-in registration on Monday, January 28 from 6-7:00 in the entrance of the Grand Island High School. Please register early as some classes may be filled or cancelled.
- **2. Age Requirement:** Students must be 18 years or older to enroll in an adult class.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Fees: The fee for each class is listed with each course description. Make check payable to "Grand Island Schools." Certain classes include lab fees payable to the instructors on the first night of class. A \$20 fee will be charged for any checks returned by the bank. Some classes offer a senior citizens discount (SC). Senior age = 60+

Cancellation information: If a class is filled or cancelled, the full fee will be refunded. Personal requests for cancellation must be made at least 2 business days prior to the start of the class to receive a refund.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION SCHEDULE AND LOCATION:

The Winter session begins the week of January 28. Most classes meet for 10 sessions. All classes are held at the Grand Island High School and Middle School on Ransom Road unless otherwise specified. Community Education activities will be cancelled when regular day school sessions are cancelled due to holidays, bad weather, or other emergencies. One week only, at the end of the ten-week semester, has been allotted for making up cancelled classes. Unless noted, a maximum of 25 students per class will be allowed. A minimum of 8 students will be required for most classes.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS: In the event the school is closed due to weather conditions or an emergency, all Community Education classes will be closed without further notification.
