The Erie County Sheriff's Office responded to 356 calls the week of this report. Below is a sampling of the noteworthy incidents in **Grand Island**.

12/31	DWI/Alcohol	West River Rd.	Deputies investigated a vehicle off of the road. The driver exhibited signs of intoxication. Deputies performed standardized field sobriety tests on the vehicle driver. The driver was arrested for DWI. The driver was processed and released to a sober third party and the vehicle was placed under a twelve-hour hold.
12/31	Disturbance – Public Place	Sandpiper Ln	Deputies responded to a complaint of an unauthorized person dumping trash in a company dumpster. Deputies were able to locate the subject. The subject was in fact authorized to use the dumpster. All parties advised.
01/01	DWI/Alcohol	Bedell @ Grand Island Bd.	Deputies initiated a traffic stop of a vehicle after witnessing traffic violations. The driver exhibited signs of intoxication and standardized field sobriety tests were conducted. The vehicle operator was arrested for DWI and other traffic infractions. Breath test revealed a .21 BAC, nearly three times the legal limit. The operator was processed and released to a sober third party and the vehicle was placed on a twelve-hour hold.
01/02	First Aid – Drug Related	Grand Island Bd.	Deputies were notified of a possible overdose. The subject was found face down and was blue in the face as well as exhibiting agonal breathing. Narcan was administered to the subject and the subject regained consciousness. The subject was transported to the hospital for further treatment and evaluation.
01/03	Larcenies from Vehicles	Grand Island	Deputies received many calls of unlocked vehicles that had someone enter and go through the items in the vehicle. Several reported that items of value were missing. Police reports completed and investigation is continuing. All vehicles entered were unlocked and the cases that had items missing were due to valuables being left in the unlocked vehicle.
