The Erie County Sheriff's Office responded to 322 calls the week of this report. Below is a sampling of the noteworthy incidents in **Grand Island**.

Date	Туре	Street	Narrative
3/7	Property Found	Long Rd. @ Baseline Rd.	Deputies were called to meet a male at the station who found a 16 gauge shotgun on the side of the road. Deputies took possession of the gun at the station and turned it over to the armory for safe keeping.
3/8	First Aid Related	Baseline Rd.	Deputies and State Police received a call from a female saying that her attached defibulator was malfunctioning and keeps shocking her, went off five times so far and she feels like she's going to pass out. Patrol and EMS arrived to assist and transport her to Sister's Hospital.
3/9	Fire Residential	Riverdale Dr.	Deputies responded to a possible house fire called in by homeowner. Deputies arrived to find the house fully engulfed. Deputies and Fire cleared the house and attempted to find dogs. Fire Investigator was requested and a report was completed.
3/10	DWI/Alcohol	Elmwood Rd.	Deputies received a call from a resident on Elmwood Rd. saying a vehicle crashed into the ditch. Deputies arrived and located the driver who appeared to be intoxicated. Deputies administered roadside tests and driver taken into custody for DWI. Driver was processed at the station and registered a BAC of .22, almost three times the legal limit. Driver was released to sober third party.
3/10	Assault	Bedell Rd.	Deputies were called to the apartments on Bedell Rd. for a possible assault. Mother called to advise patrol that her daughter was assaulted by her boyfriend. Crime scene unit responded and processed the scene and the daughter's injuries. The subject returned to the apartment a short time later. Subject was arrested , processed for the assault, and transported to the Erie County Holding Center, held pending arraignment.
3/12	DWI/Alcohol	Fix Rd. @ South State Pkwy	Deputies initiated a traffic stop after observing traffic violations. Deputies determined that the driver displayed signs of intoxication. The driver was administered field sobriety tests and arrested for DWI. He later registered a BAC of .17, almost double the legal limit. He was charged with DWI, processed, and released to a sober third party.
