The Erie County Sheriff's Office responded to 266 calls the week of this report. Below is a sampling of the noteworthy incidents in **Grand Island**.

Date	Type	Street	Narrative
9/6	Larceny from a Vehicle	Whitehaven Rd.	Deputies responded to a vehicle in the apartment complex that had been gone through overnight. Caller was missing items from the trunk of the vehicle. He thinks it was Saturday night sometime. Police report completed.
9/8	Traffic Stop/Narcotics	I-190 @ Whitehaven Rd.	Deputies initiated a traffic stop on a Ford Fusion with NY plates showing a Dodge Sedan. Upon speaking with the driver, it was determined that his NYS was suspended. Deputies completed an inventory of the vehicle and found narcotics. Deputies were also unable to determine who the vehicle currently belonged to as the driver could not provide information for the owner and it was last registered in PA. Subject was arrested, processed, and released. Vehicle will be held in impound until the owner can be contacted.
9/10	Mental	Center Court South	Deputies arrived to a disturbance at the apartments. Deputies spoke with all parties and one male was being belligerent and was highly intoxicated. Male began to fight with patrol and was detained. Male was still being irate and threatening suicide so he was transported to ECMC on MHL 9.41 papers.
9/10	Shoplifting	Top's Markets	Deputies received a call from management at Top's in regards to a shoplifting. Deputies were told they recovered the merchandise but the subjects left in a white Scion. Deputies found the vehicle occupied in the lot occupied by a male and a female matching the description of the subjects. After investigation both subjects, were arrested, issued appearance tickets, and turned over to Niagara County Sheriff's for active warrants.
9/11	Marine-Other	Grass Island	Deputies were contacted about a boat speeding by Grass Island, striking the rocks, launching, and getting airborne. Caller believes it is now disabled. Grand Island Fire and Niagara County Sheriff's located the boat and the two occupants. They were treated at the scene and released.
