WHEREAS; in 2008 the Town contracted with Environmental Design & Research (EDR) to develop a Master Plan for the property that demonstrates that the project could be implemented in a way that will achieve the goal of public access and interpretation without compromising the environmental values that define the ecological character of the site; and

WHEREAS; the project involves application and approval of necessary regulatory permits, archaeology, design, and assessments; clearing and grubbing for a parking lot; installation of stone dust primary and secondary trails; installation of low-impact, environmentally friendly boardwalk; placement of interpretive signage and kiosks; and vegetative buffers; and

WHEREAS; Scenic Woods is envisioned to be a year-round facility that will offer the public a variety of passive recreational opportunities ranging from walking, jogging, and bicycling, to bird watching, cross country skiing and snowshoeing; and

WHEREAS; the project will diversify the recreational resource base on Grand Island and its design will meet the needs of an aging population while providing a sanctuary for visitors who want to experience the natural environment while promoting healthy lifestyles;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED that Peter McMahon, Supervisor of the Town of Grand Island, is hereby authorized and directed to file an application for funds from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation in accordance with the provisions of Title 9 of the Environmental Protection Act of 1993, in an amount not to exceed \$400,000, and upon approval of said request to enter into and execute a project agreement with the State for such financial assistance to the Town for the Scenic Woods – Bicentennial Park Project. The Town of Grand Island will be responsible for all grant administration, oversight and reporting required through this application. The Town of Grand Island ensures that start-up capital and the required match will be provided should an award be made.

Further, it is RESOLVED that the Town of Grand Island reaffirms the Town of Grand Island Comprehensive Plan (Revised November 1998) and the recommendations therein regarding the development of park property.
